



News & Info

LUNACON TO MISS 2015

Lunacon <www.lunacon.org>—a longstanding sf/f convention sponsored by New York Science Fiction Society (aka the Lunarians)—has announced that they will be skipping 2015. Dates for 2016 have already been announced (18–20 March 2016). Few other details are available but it has been said that those with a 2015 membership will be offered the option of a refund or rollover to 2016.

MWFF SUFFERS CHEMICAL INCIDENT

The Hyatt Regency O'Hare—headquarters hotel for Chicago-area con Midwest Furfest—was evacuated in the early wee hours of Sunday 7 December 2014 when a significant amount of chlorine was released. Nineteen people (many of them Furfest attendees) who complained of nausea and dizziness were transported to local hospitals for treatment; though fortunately many of them were released quickly. It does not appear that there were any serious injuries. The all-clear to move back into the hotel came at 4:21A.

The gas release is being investigated as a criminal matter. It

reportedly happened as the result of chlorine powder scattered in a 9th floor stairwell. Also, the hotel reportedly does not have a pool, so it seems unlikely that chlorine powder (possibly calcium hypochlorite) would be kept on hand by the hotel.

During the evacuation, hotel residents—including furies in costume—were given shelter from the cold at other hotels and at a convention center across the street. The latter was, ironically, hosting a dog show.

HORVATH ANNOUNCES FOR TAFF

Nina Horvath of Vienna has announced her candidacy for the Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund according to TAFF co-administrator Jim Mowatt. Horvath joins Wolf von Witting, who declared for the race a few months ago.

FFANZ VOTING OPENS

Voting has opened for the 2015 Fan Fund of New Zealand and Australia. With only one name on the ballot—Melbourne's David McDonald—the winner is pretty clearcut, though the money accompanying each vote is still needed to fund McDonald's trip to New Zealand. He will attend Reconnaissance <www.timelord2067.com/convention.html>, the 36th New Zealand National Science Fiction, Fantasy, and Horror Convention, to be held 3–6 April 2015 (Easter weekend) at the Sudima Lake Rotorua hotel in Rotorua, New Zealand (on the North Island).

NZ WORLDCON BID UPDATE

The 2020 Worldcon bid for New Zealand <www.nzin2020.org> is a good bit firmer than it was after receiving what they deem sufficient commitments from "local" (Australasian) fans to work the convention should they win. An appeal was posted in late November 2014, asking for at least 200 commitments by 5 December and that was apparently achieved. The bid is looking for support from other parts of the world, of course, but wanted to make sure there would be enough boots on the ground locally to do the work necessary there.

JOE BUCKLEY LIVES (AND DIES)—FOR CHARITY

As many of you know, numerous Baen Books authors have inserted Joe Buckley <thefifthimperium.com> as a character in their books, usually killing him off in the process. Now Baen has collected many of those instances into a \$2.99 ebook <www.baenebooks.com/p-2613-the-many-deaths-of-joe-buckley.aspx>—even including some never-before-seen material. All proceeds will be split between two charities—Operation Baen Bulk (books and other supplies for US armed forces personnel) and ReadAssist (giving disabled readers free access to Baen ebooks).


BRO. CONSOLMAGNO TO ACCEPT SAGAN AT SASQUAN

Brother Guy J. Consolmagno, an active fan and an astronomer at the Vatican Observatory, will give his acceptance speech for the Carl Sagan Medal for Excellence in Public Communication in Planetary Science <dps.aas.org/prizes/sagan> at the 2015 Worldcon.

The award is given by the American Astronomical Society's Division for Planetary Sciences. Consolmagno's acceptance speech will be on the second night of Sasquan, to be held 19–23 August 2015 at the Spokane Convention Center and nearby hotels in Spokane WA.

HACHETTE AND AMAZON BURY HATCHET

After almost a year of all-out war, publisher Hachette and



uber-bookseller Amazon have finally signed a new contract. Similar to the Amazon–Simon & Schuster agreement announced almost a month earlier, Hachette is said to now have the power to set prices for their e-books at Amazon. Predictably, both Amazon and Hachette say they are happy with the deal. Authors are also likely happy, since Hachette books (including e-books) will now presumably be available for pre-order once again and apparently intentional slowdowns in deliveries will stop. Whether customers will be as happy remains to be seen.

TERRAFORM ONLINE MAGAZINE LAUNCHED

Another online sf magazine has hit the intertubes. *Terraform* <motherboard.vice.com/terraform> is a production of Vice Media Group and their online platform Motherboard. It is in some places reported as a weekly 'zine, but that seems to mean publishing one new piece of short genre fiction a week. But hey, it's free, so *nema problema*.

No Need for a Questing Beast—Chapter 10

PED: I’ll try to be clear, then. Anyway, the land I’m looking for has a known portal in the air, somewhere over London. I would try to avoid such a public area. There was likely at least one portal in the past from somewhere in the Americas. That was likely a one-time gate. There remains a, very probable, water gate; down here in this lake, somewhere. It seems likely that it was not a one-time gate, but has been closed for centuries. I hope to find it and force a passage through.

Luna: So, what are you trying to find, ultimately?

PED: A very special kind of... dust. May I... sniff you?

Luna: (Perplexed) Sniff me?

PED: The olfactory equivalent of staring at someone; and staring is often considered rude. Are you a v... a princess?

Luna: (Laughs) Princess! Good gracious no. Go ahead and sniff, then. I’ll sniff you back.
