CONCOM MEETINGS



SATURN V SHOT IN DRIVE-BY

The Saturn V on display in the Davidson Center building at the U.S. Space & Rocket Center <www.ussrc.com> was struck by at least one bullet in an apparent drive-by shooting in early May. As this article was being written, police reports indicate a 308-caliber rifle was fired from a car driving down I-565, in front of the USS&RC property. Based on Google Maps, that would make the range about 100–150 yards, depending on which lane the car was in. The front windows of the building were hit three times. Depending on the news report you believe, either two or one of those shots went on to hit the rocket, albeit without penetrating the metal skin.

The USS&RC was open at the time (about 10A) but fortunately no one was hurt in the attack. The Davidson Center was evacuated (apparently in an orderly fashion). The overall center reopened

for business shortly after noon the same day, though reports were not clear on now long the Davidson Center building itself was closed.

The Saturn V is technically owned by the Smithsonian and on loan to the USS&RC, raising the possibility that there could be a federal investigation.

CANADA UNITES, AGAIN

The 2012 Canadian Unity Fan Fund vote was won by Debra Yeung, who will travel to Canvention (the Canadian natcon). That convention will be held this year in conjunction with When Words Collide www.whenwordscollide.org, to be held 10–12 August 2012 at the Best Western Village Park Inn in Calgary AB.

The administrator (Kent Pollard) reported that the total was 29 votes for Ms Yeung, 12 for Jane Garthson, and 1 No Preference. Voting donations totaled \$CDN302.48. Two of Ms Yeung's nominators were regular *Shuttle* LoCer Lloyd Penney and his wife Yvonne.

OLDER WRITERS' GRANT DEADLINE EXTENDED

Due to a server glitch that deleted all emails received over about a dozen days in February and March, the Speculative Literature Foundation www.speculativeliterature.org has extended the deadline for their Older Writers' Grant to 31 May 2012. Details can be found online at www.speclit.org/Grants/SLFOlderWriters.php. The grant is \$750 and is for a writer who is 50 years of age or older and "who is just starting to work at a professional level."

DUFF KERFUFFLE

As this is being written, nominations for the Down Under Fan Fund have just closed, after a nom period of less than two weeks. The ballot is supposed to be published as soon as possible but voting will be open for less than three weeks, closing 31 May. This timing is such that the winner for this "east to west" year would be unable to attend the New Zealand natcon (to be held 1–4 June) unless they departed North America before the winner was announced and would be hard pressed to even make arrangements in time for the Australian natcon (to be held 8–11 June).

This has caused much gnashing of teeth on the web—and no small amount of vitriol. One announced *candidate* has said he plans to vote for "Hold Over Funds" and encourages others to do so also. Fun times.

SHOULD THERE BE A YA HUGO?

Much discussion has bloomed in the blogosphere about the possibility of a Hugo for Best Young Adult Book. A proposal has been submitted to the Business Meeting for this years Worldcon that calls for such a Hugo, with YA books of any length being eligible. Of the proposers (Chris M. Barkley, Lou Berger, Bobbi DuFault, Juli Hanslip, Dan Kimmel, and Stu Segal), Mr. Barkley has been perhaps the most forward of the group and has taken the most flack from opponents.

TOM DOHERTY SINGS FREE BIRD

Tor Books <www.tor.com>, in the person of Tom Doherty, has announced they will be dropping Digital Rights Management from all ebooks as of July 2012. This will include not only Tor itself, but the Orb, Starscape, and Tor Teen imprints as well.

Tor isn't the first genre publisher to make this move (Baen is an example probably familiar to many *Shuttle* readers) but it's the first to do so that's part of the so-called Big Six (Hachette, Macmillan—which owns Tor, Penguin, HarperCollins, Random House, and Simon & Schuster). Tor is also one of the biggest dogs—likely *the* Big Dog—in English-language sf/f publishing so it's possible this nudge from them may cause other dominos to fall. [How's that for mixed metaphors? -ED]

SF HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES ANNOUNCED

The 2012 inductees to the Science Fiction Hall of Fame tinyurl.com/SFHoF> have been announced—James Cameron, Virgil Finlay, Joe Haldeman, and James Tiptree, Jr. The SFHoF has been closed, but will reopen as part of the "Icons of Science Fiction" exhibit at the Experience Music Project Museum on 9 June 2012 in Seattle WA.

CDC PREPARES FOR ZOMBIE APOCALYPSE

The Centers for Disease Control want to help you upgrade your Zombie Preparedness <www.cdc.gov/phpr/zombies.htm>.

The CDC says the site "began as a tongue in cheek campaign to engage new audiences with preparedness messages [and] has proven to be a very effective platform." It turns out that being prepared for zombies has a lot in common with being prepared for tornados, or earthquakes, or disease outbreaks, or whatever might haunt your nightmares. The site includes a Graphic Novella, the plot of which—up until the last couple of pages—would fit right in at your local comic book store or specialty bookshop. SUPERMAN, SUPER RIGHTS, SUPER PRICE

The canceled check used by Detective Comics (later DC

Comics) the purchase rights to Superman and several other characters from Jerome Siegel and Joe Shuster was sold recently. The



check fetched \$160,000 in an online auction conducted by <ComicConnect.com>. The Super rights originally went for \$130, the check totaled around \$400 for all the characters.
