#### **NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY**




#### **HUGO UPDATES**

Pursuant to recent changes in the Worldcon Constitution, folks should be aware that you must be a member of the 2019 (Dublin) Worldcon (or have been a member of the 2018 [San José] Worldcon) by 31 December 2018 to be eligible to nominate for 2019 Hugo Awards. For the final round, you must be a member of the 2019 Worldcon by the time voting closes for that round. Dublin had previously announced that they will exercise their right to hold a vote on the 1944 Retrospective Hugo Awards. The same deadlines will apply to those awards.

Dublin has recently announced that they will exercise their right to hold a vote on a special Hugo category—in this case for Best Art Book. The category will be added to both the 2019 Hugo Awards and the 1944 Retrospective Hugo Awards.

### FANNISH INQUISITION(S)

Videos of theFannish Inquisition panel at the 2018 SMOF-Con <smofcon.com> (held 30 November–2 December 2018 at the Flamingo Conference Resort and Spa in Santa Rosa CA) have been posted to a YouTube playlist. #### NASFIC HOSTING CHESLEYS; OTHER UPDATES

The 2019 North American Science Fiction Convention (Spikecon <www.spikecon.org>, to be held 4–7 July 2019 at the Hilton Garden Inn and the attached Davis Conference Center in Layton UT) has made a few announcements of general fannish interest. (Note that the NASFiC, Westercon 72, and 1632 Minicon [centering on Eric Flint's 1632 series] are being run together.)

- They will be hosting the 2019 Chesley Awards (sponsored by the Association of Science Fiction & Fantasy Artists <www. asfa-art.org>).
- NASFiC Masters of Ceremony, Bjo Trimble and John Trimble will be sponsored by photographer/writer/fan Ctein.
- The associated Westercon has added The GM Tim (Tim Mottishaw) as a Gaming Guest of Honor.
- A separately ticketed "Trek Breakfast" will take place the morning of 4 July featuring the Trimbles and Dragon Dronet. TAFF VOTING OPENS

Voting for the 2019 Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund (eastbound) has opened. The North American candidates are Teresa Cochran, Sarah Gulde, Michael Lowrey (aka Orange Mike), and Geri Sullivan. The winner will be expected to travel to Dublin's Worldcon 77

to be held 15–19 August 2019 at Convention Centre Dublin and other nearby facilities. The winner may also attend other European cons or fannish events.

Voting requires a donation of at least \$4/£3/€3. Online voting is available at <taff.org.uk/vote.php>. A printable PDF <taff.org.uk/ballots/taff2019.pdf> (A4) is also available for mail-in votes (US and European addresses on the form). Voting closes 22 April 2019.

#### **GUFF VOTING OPENS**

Voting for the 2019 Get-Up-and-over Fan Fund (northbound) has opened. The Australasian candidates are Lynelle Howell, Simon Litten, and Nicole Murphy. The winner will be expected to travel to Worldcon 77 and may also attend other European cons or fannish events.

# SHIMMER PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS CHOSEN

The Shimmer Program <a href="www.facebook.com/shimmerprogram">www.facebook.com/shimmerprogram</a> has chosen two Chinese fans to send to Worldcon 77. Winners Hu Yue (aka Constance Hu) and Chen Xuchang (aka Amelia Chen) will each receive a stipend of RMB 10,000 (about \$1,450 at press time) to travel to and work at the con. Quoting the announcement of the winners, "They are expected to gain experience in the Worldcon organizational work and help with future Chinese bids." The program is sponsored by Storycom, which "is the first professional story commercialization agency in China."

#### MARVEL UNIVERSE LIVE COMING TO HUNTSVILLE

The arena show Marvel Universe Live <www.marveluniverse live.com> is coming to Huntsville (among many other cities). Headliner characters presented in the show include "Spider-Man, Iron Man, Captain America, Thor, Black Panther, Hulk, Black Widow, and The Guardians of the Galaxy."

Huntsville shows are at the Von Braun Center Arena 14–16 December 2018 (6 shows in total). Tickets start at \$15 and run to \$65 (all plus Ticketmaster fees).

#### WHO GIVES A F#¢&? DEADPOOL GIVES ALL OF 'EM

A PG-13(!) "reimagining" of *Deadpool* 2, yclept *Once Upon a Deadpool* <www.foxmovies.com/movies/once-upon-a-deadpool>,



will be in theaters 12 December 2018 (with some theaters opening it a day early to squeeze in the limited run). Their tagline is apt—"A Deadpool fairy tale that gives zero F's." Star Ryan Reynolds agreed to the film on the condition that \$1 of every ticket sold be donated to charity—specifically to Fuck Cancer <www.letsfcancer.com>, which has temporarily rebranded itself "Fudge Cancer" in honor of the PG-13 rating.

#### **GOLDEN GLOBES NOMS**

Nominees for the 76th Golden Globe Awards <www.golden globes.com> include several genre films and TV shows. The awards will be presented in a televised ceremony 6 January 2019, 7P Central time, on NBC.

Leading the genre pack is *Mary Poppins Returns* with 4 nominations (for Motion Picture—Musical or Comedy, Actress in a Motion Picture—Musical or Comedy [Emily Blunt], Actor in a Motion Picture—Musical or Comedy [Lin-Manuel Miranda], and Original Score—Motion Picture). *Black Panther* was not far behind, with 3 nods (for Motion Picture—Drama, Original Score—Motion Picture, and Original Song—Motion Picture ["All the Stars"]).

Three different works took 2 honors each: *The Good Place* (TV Series—Musical or Comedy and Actress in a TV Series—Musical or Comedy [Kristen Bell]); *The Handmaid's Tale* (Actress in a TV Series—Drama [Elisabeth Moss] and Supporting Actress in a Series, Limited Series, or Motion Picture Made for TV [Yvonne Strahovski]); and *Isle of Dogs* (Motion Picture—Animated and Original Score—Motion Picture).

Eight genre works got a single nom: *Incredibles 2* (Motion Picture—Animated), *Mirai* (Motion Picture—Animated), *Outlander* (Actress in a TV Series—Drama [Caitriona Balfe]), *A Quiet Place* (Original Score—Motion Picture), *Ralph Breaks the Internet* (Motion Picture—Animated), *Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse* (Motion Picture—Animated), and *Westworld* (Supporting Actress in a Series, Limited Series, or Motion Picture Made for TV [Thandie Newton]).

Additionally of likely interest to fans, biopic *First Man* took 2 nominations: Supporting Actress in any Motion Picture (Claire Foy) and Original Score—Motion Picture.
